is to be the region's premier arts and science destination, inspiring lifelong discovery and inclusive experiences.

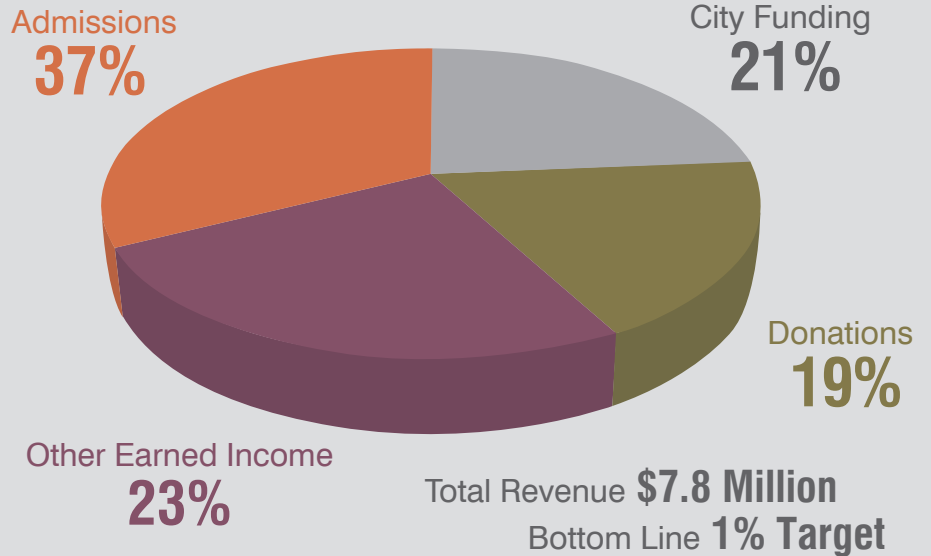
Our History

The Washington Pavilion opened its doors in June of 1999 in the renovated, historic building that served as Washington High School from 1908-1992. This historic transformation was accomplished through the support of public and private funding.

Kirby Science Discovery Center

Interactive, Hands-on Fun & Learning

- **80,000 patrons** visit annually
- **20,000** school and group patron visits annually
- Exhibit refresh underway: new **Stage Science** completed in 2015, new **Space Gallery** to be completed in 2016
- Numerous **special events** including Design Challenge, Science Fairs, Boy & Girl Scout events
- Wells Fargo CineDome: **60-ft-wide, 4-story screen** showing a variety of **Hollywood films** and mission-based educational documentaries



Visual Arts Center

Cosmopolitan Galleries in the Heart of Sioux Falls

- **7 galleries**, 11,000 square feet
- **23,000 visitors** annually
- Approximately **20 exhibitions** annually
- Exhibits range from noted South Dakota artists to **Andy Warhol** and **Rodin**
- More than **1,500 art pieces** in our permanent collection
- **Accredited** by the American Alliance of Museums
- Numerous **special events** including Arts Night, Sidewalk Arts Festivals, lectures and gallery talks

- Serve over **30,000** annually
